The Minor Festival of St. Michael and All Angels

September 29th has been a commemoration of St. Michael and All Angels since the 12th century. Lutherans retained this celebration because it gives glory to Christ for providing angels to serve God's people. Philip Melanthon, who worked closely with Martin Luther during the Reformation, wrote a hymn for this minor festival: "Lord God, to You We Give All Praise." We sing this hymn today as our Hymn of the Day. We join our voices today in praising the only Savior together with all the saints and angels and look forward to the day we gather around the throne of God with all the saints and angels forever.





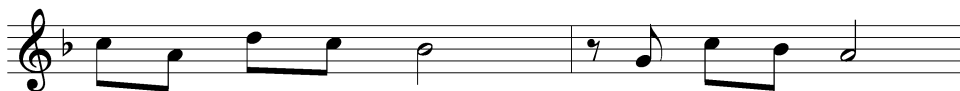
